#### CHAPTER CCLXXXI.

AN ACT additional to "An Act to set off part of lot numbered ten, in the eleventh range, from the town of Canton, and annex the same to the town of Jay," passed February third, eighteen hundred and twenty-four.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That so Part of Lot No. much of the lot of land numbered nine, in the elev-9,11th range, enth range, in the town of Canton, as lies east of the Canton to Jay. west side of the town road leading through said lot of land, is hereby set off from the town of Canton, and annexed to the town of Jay: Provided, That the proprietor of said land shall be holden to pay all to be paid. assessments assessed on said land, and remaining unpaid prior to the passing of this Act.

Sect. 2. Be it further enacted, That so much of the Act to which this is in addition, as is inconsistent with the provisions of this act, be, and the same

is hereby repealed.

### CHAPTER CCLXXXII.

AN ACT additional to the Act incorporating the Bar Mill Bridge Proprietors.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That Paul Woodman, Shubael Woodman, Pelatiah Harmon Persons added to the former and John Woodman, Junr. be, and they hereby are corporation, associated with Ellis B. Usher, the person named in the Act to which this Act is additional, and are hereby invested with all the rights, powers and privileges that are granted in and by the Act aforesaid, their powers to the said Ellis B. Usher, in the same manner as if they had been named in the Act establishing the Corporation aforesaid.
