CHAPTER LXXXI.

Resolve laying a Tax on the several Counties.

Whereas the Treasurers of the several counties in the State, have laid their accounts before the Legislature, which accounts have been examined and allowed: And whereas the Clerks of the Courts of Sessions for said counties have exhibited estimates made by said Courts, of the necessary charges which may arise within the said several counties for the year ensuing, and of the sums necessary to discharge the debts of said counties:

Resolved, That the sums annexed to the several counties contained in the following Schedule, be, and the same are hereby granted as a Tax for each county, respectively, to be apportioned, assessed, paid, collected and applied for the purposes

aforesaid, according to law.

YORK, Four thousand and five hundred dollars.

CUMBERLAND, Ten thousand dollars.

Lincoln, Six thousand and seven hundred dollars. Four thousand and eight hundred dollars.

Hancock, Five thousand dollars. Washington, Three thousand dollars.

Oxford, Three thousand and five hundred dollars,

Somerset, Two thousand dollars.

Penobscor, Two thousand and six hundred dollars.
