That said corporation shall be held to pay the Treasurer of the State the same amount of tax due from them as a Bank corporation, which they would have been liable to pay, had their capital stock been paid in at the time required by their charter.

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## CHAPTER CCCXLII.

AN ACT to change the name of North-hill.

Name changed  
to Brighton.

*BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That, from and after the passing of this Act, the name of the town of North-hill, in the county of Somerset, shall cease, and the said town shall thereafter be called and known by the name of Brighton; but nothing in this Act shall be so construed as to impair the existing rights of said corporation.*

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## CHAPTER CCCXLIII.

AN ACT to incorporate the Trustees of the Charity Fund of Mount Vernon Chapter.

Persons incor-  
porated.

Fowers, &c.

May hold estate,  
&c.

*SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That Eleazer Wyer, Oliver Gerrish and Luther Richardson, their associates and successors be, and they hereby are, incorporated into a body politic, by the name of the Trustees of the Charity Fund of Mount Vernon Chapter, with power to prosecute and defend suits at law, to have a common seal, and to change the same; to make and put in execution any by-laws, for the management of their affairs, not repugnant to the laws of the State; to take and hold, for charitable and benevolent uses, any real and*

personal estate to the value of ten thousand dollars; and to give, grant, or bargain and sell the same, with all such privileges, immunities and powers as are incident to corporations instituted for purposes of charity and beneficence.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That the first meeting of said corporation shall be holden at such time and place, and be notified in such manner, as a majority of the persons herein named shall direct. First meeting, how called, &c.

SECT. 3. *Be it further enacted,* That the powers granted by this Act may be enlarged, restrained or annulled, at the pleasure of the Legislature. Powers restricted

#### CHAPTER CCCCXLIV.

An ACT to incorporate the town of Liberty.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That the Plantation called and known by the name of Montville, in the county of Lincoln, bounded southwestwardly and northwestwardly by the northeastwardly line of the town of Washington, and the southeastwardly line of the town of Palermo, continued till they meet; northeastwardly by the town of Montville, and southeastwardly by a line from the southwardly corner of said town of Montville to the northwardly corner of said town of Washington, be incorporated into a town by the name of Liberty. Boundaries.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That until a new apportionment of Representatives, said town of Liberty shall, for the purpose of choosing a Representative in the Legislature, be classed with the town of Montville in like manner as before the passage of this Act. Provision for the choice of Representative.
