SECT. 4. *Be it further enacted*, That any three members of said board may appoint the time and place of the first meeting of the same, and notify the members thereof accordingly, by an advertisement in one of the public newspapers printed in Portland. And the presence of a majority of the members of said board shall always be necessary for the transaction of any business, except to adjourn.

First meeting, how called.

Majority necessary to transact business.

SECT. 5. *Be it further enacted*, That the powers granted by this Act may be enlarged, restrained or taken away, at the pleasure of the Legislature

CHAPTER CCCCLV.

An Additional ACT respecting Ferry Point Bridge.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That so much of the second section of "An Act to incorporate the Proprietors of Ferry Point Bridge" as requires said Bridge to be built "over the salt water falls above the mills," be, and the same hereby is repealed.

CHAPTER CCCCLVI.

AN ACT to incorporate the Portland, Saco and Parsonsfield Stage Company.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled*, That Thomas S. Abbott, Joseph Bailey, Israel Chadbourn, Solomon Strout, James McArthur, Arthur McArthur, George Small, Jun^r, Clement J. Adams, Aaron C. Waldron, and their associates and successors, be, and they hereby are constituted a body politic and cor-

porate, by the name of the Portland, Saco and Parsonsfield Stage Company, for the purpose of establishing and continuing a line of Stages, from Parsonsfield, in this State, to Saco and Portland, in this State ; with power to prosecute and defend suits at law ; to have a common seal, and to alter the same ; to make any by-laws for the management of their affairs, not repugnant to the laws of this State ; to take and hold any real and personal estate, to the value of five thousand dollars ; and to give and grant or bargain and sell the same, and with all the privileges usually granted to other corporations for similar purposes : *Provided however,* That the powers granted by this Act, may be enlarged, restrained or annulled, at the pleasure of the Legislature.

Powers, &c.

Proviso--restrict-
ing powers.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That if any person or persons, or body corporate, shall recover judgment and execution against the corporation hereby established, it shall be lawful for the officer having such execution, in case he cannot find personal property of said corporation, wherewith to satisfy such execution, to serve and levy the same upon the body or bodies, or real or personal estate of any person or persons who shall be, or shall within six years next preceding have been, members of the said corporation.

SECT. 3. *Be it further enacted,* That Arthur McArthur, above named, may call the first meeting of such corporation, at such time and place as he may direct, giving ten days, at least, previous notice thereof, in one of the public newspapers printed at Portland.
