CHAPTER CCCCLXIX.

AN ACT additional to "An Act to establish the Damariscotta Canal."

Act of incorporation to be void unless the Canal be completed within six years.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That if the said Canal Corporation shall not complete said Canal within six years from the passage of this Act, then the Act to which this is additional shall be void.

Part of former act repealed.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That the seventh section of the Act to which this is additional, be, and the same is hereby repealed.

CHAPTER CCCCLXX.

AN ACT to incorporate the Proprietors of Edgecomb Bridge.

Persons incorporated.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That Stephen Parsons, William M. Boyd, James Drummond, William M. Read, Aaron Blaney, John McKown, Abiel Wood, Moses Shaw, Moses Davis, and Rufus Sewall, their associates and successors, be, and they hereby are constituted a body politic and corporate, by the name of the Proprietors of Edgecomb Bridge, for the purpose of building a bridge across Sheepscot river from Davis's Island in Edgecomb to some suitable point in Wiscasset, northwardly of Union Wharf; with power to prosecute and defend suits at law; to have and use a common seal; to make any by-laws for the convenient management of their affairs, not repugnant to the laws of the State; to make such contracts and purchases as may be necessary for
