Chapter 19.

AN additional Act respecting the Municipal Court.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That the Judge of the Municipal Court of the town of Portland be and he hereby is empowered to exercise the same jurisdiction, within the County of Cumberland, in actions of replevin, which is granted to Justices of the Peace by virtue of an Act, entitled "An act defining the duties and powers of Justices of the Peace respecting actions of replevin," passed the fourth day of March one thousand eight hundred and twenty nine.

[Approved by the Governor, February 27, 1832.]

Chapter 20.

AN ACT for the Preservation of North Turner Bridge.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That if any person after the first day of April next shall wilfully ride or drive any horse or horses over or upon the North Turner Bridge faster than at a walk, he shall forfeit and pay for each offence a fine of three dollars, to be recovered by the Treasurer of the Proprietors of said Bridge in an action of debt to the use of said Proprietors; Provided, said Proprietors shall erect and keep constantly exposed to view in some conspicuous place at each end of said bridge a board or sign on which this regulation shall be fairly and legibly printed.

Penalty for riding or driving over North Turner Bridge, faster than at a walk—\$3.00.

Proviso.
