Chapter 28.

Resolve in favor of Reuben Murch.

Approved February 21, 1832.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the Treasury of the State to Reuben Murch of Gorham the sum of seventy five dollars, in remuneration for an injury sustained by him while on militia duty.

Chapter 29.

Resolve authorizing the Land Agent to sell Public lands in the Counties of Hancock and Washington.

Approved February 21, 1832.

Resolved, That the Land Agent be, and hereby is authorized to sell, at public sale, in the Counties where situated, all the State lands in the Counties of Hancock and Washington, consisting of lots and parts of townships, lying South of the North line of Bingham's purchase.

Chapter 30.

Resolve in favor of Samuel Shorey.

Approved February 21, 1832.

Resolved, That the Land Agent be and hereby is authorized to convey to Samuel Shorey, or his assigns, a lot of land numbered thirty eight in township No. one Old Indian Purchase, East of Penobscot river; he having performed the settling duties required by law. *Provided* said Shorey shall pay to the Land Agent, the amount, with interest thereon, due to the State for said lot, according to a former contract.
