### Chapter 55.

Resolve in favor of J. R. Stinson, Peleg Bradford and Abner H. Wade.

Approved March 3, 1832.

On the petition of J. R. Stinson, Peleg Bradford and Abner H. Wade of Woolwich in the County of Lincoln, praying that they may be refunded the sum of one hundred and eighty nine dollars and one cent, for so much money paid Wilmot Wood, Esq., Agent to this State, and for the use of the same, on account of their being sureties to William Boynton, Deputy Sheriff,

*Resolved*, For reasons set forth in the petition aforesaid, there be remitted and paid to said Stinson, Bradford and Wade, out of the Treasury of this State the sum of forty six dollars and twelve cents ; being part of a sum of money paid by them as aforesaid for the default of William Boynton. And the Governor with consent of Council is hereby authorized to draw his warrant on the Treasurer for the same, in favor of said Stinson, Bradford and Wade.

### Chapter 56.

Resolve in favor of Elisha Hilton.

Approved March 3, 1832.

*Resolved*, That there be paid out of the Treasury of this State to Elisha Hilton, the sum of twenty five dollars in full for his services in clearing out obstructions in the Canada Road.

### Chapter 57.

Resolve in favor of I. Berry & Co.

Approved March 3, 1832.

*Resolved*, That there be paid out of the Treasury of the State, to I. Berry & Co., Printers to the State, seven hundred dollars on account of printing for the State, to be accounted for by said Berry & Co. to the next Legisla-
