Chapter 62.

Resolve in favor of Samuel Chamberlain, of Foxcroft.

Approved March 5, 1832.

Whereas Samuel Chamberlain of the House of Representatives, while attending upon the service of the State as a member of said House, at the present session, has been sick, and has, on that account, been subject to expense—Therefore,—

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid out of the Treasury of this State to said Chamberlain, in addition to his pay for travel and attendance, the sum of ten dollars.

Chapter 63.

Resolve in favor of the Orphan Asylum in Portland.

Approved March 5, 1832.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the State Treasury, to the Trustees of the Orphan Asylum in Portland, the sum of forty one dollars and seventy five cents. The same to be in full for their claim on the State for furniture, given them by Resolve of April second, one thousand eight hundred and thirty one—and retained for the use of the State. And the Governor, with consent of Council is hereby authorized to draw his warrant on the Treasurer of the State, in favor of said Trustees for the sum aforesaid.

Chapter 64.

An additional Resolve directing the manner in which the laws shall be printed.

Approved March 5, 1832.

Resolved, That the Secretary of State cause the Land Agent to be furnished from time to time with two copies of the Laws and Resolves of this State, and also with two copies of Greenleaf's survey and map of Maine, for the use of the Land Offices.
