Chapter 10.

Resolve in favor of the Trustees of the town of Burlington.

Approved, February 10, 1836.

RESOLVED, That there be paid out of the Treasury of this State to the Trustees of the Ministerial and School Funds in the town of Burlington, thirteen hundred and one dollars and two cents, being the sum received by the Land Agent of this State for timber cut on the public lots in said town which sum shall be held by them as a part of said Fund.

Chapter 11.

Resolve providing for the appointment of a Public Agent to superintend certain expenditures.

Approved, February 11, 1836.

RESOLVED, That the Treasurer of State for the time being be and he hereby is appointed a Public Agent, whose duty it shall be, to cause all necessary repairs to be made upon the Public Buildings and the furniture thereof, and also upon the fences and walks upon the Public Grounds, and to procure and set out suitable ornamental and forest trees; said Agent shall also have the charge of procuring necessary furniture; and all purchases and contracts for repairs shall be made by him; and in all these respects shall cause strict economy to be used; and in order that the design of this Resolve may be carried into effect there shall be placed in the hands of said Agent a sum of money not exceeding Two Thousand Dollars for the faithful expenditure of which he shall be accountable; and in all purchases and repairs, he shall make payment in hand; and in no case shall suffer any account to be kept against the State or against himself, for the same, or any part thereof: *Provided, however*, that the Treasurer shall receive no commissions for disbursing said money.

RESOLVED, That it shall be made the duty of the Treasurer to render an account of all moneys by him expended in pursuance of the foregoing Resolve, to the Legislature, at each session thereof.
