Chapter 33.

Resolve authorizing the County Commissioners for the County of Washington to locate a County road over land belonging to the State.

Approved March 1, 1836.

RESOLVED, That the County Commissioners for the County of Washington be, and they hereby are authorised to locate a County road, of about forty rods in length over land belonging to the State, and occupied by the Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians, in the Town of Perry, near the Little River Bridge,—*Provided* said road shall be made and kept in repair free of expense to the State.

Chapter 34.

Resolve in favor of Joshua Hathaway.

Approved March 3, 1836.

RESOLVED, That the Land Agent be and he is hereby authorized to receive from Joshua Hathaway within two years payment for his four several notes due the State dated March 1st, A. D. 1832 for the sum of Two Hundred and Seventy one $\frac{82}{100}$ Dollars being the amount of the purchase money for two lots of Land in Township number Eight on the Baring and Houlton road which is to be received as a compliance with the terms of payment for said land—*Provided however* said Hathaway shall remove with his family and establish his residence thereon within the term of two years as aforesaid and—*provided further*, that he shall pay to the State the amount due on a note signed by said Hathaway and dated January 9th, A. D. 1825 the principal due on which is thirty nine $\frac{82}{100}$ Dollars or secure the payment of the same to the satisfaction of the Land Agent.
