Chapter 26.

Resolve repealing a Resolve for the relief of Lewis Bisbee.

Approved March 7, 1837.

RESOLVED, That a Resolve passed January thirty-first, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three, entitled "Resolve for the relief of Lewis Bisbee," be and the same hereby is repealed.

Chapter 27.

Resolve in favor of Benjamin Walton.

Approved March 7, 1837.

RESOLVED, That there be paid out of the Treasury of the State to Benjamin Walton the sum of Sixty Dollars in full compensation for an injury sustained by him while on Military duty.

Chapter 28.

Resolve explanatory of a "Resolve authorizing an abatement on certain claim against Isaac Curtis and others," approved February 15, 1834.

Approved March 7, 1837.

RESOLVED, That the Land Agent be, and he is hereby authorized to refund to Nathan Small, from any monies in his hands, one half of the original sum, with interest thereon, of a certain note, given by said Small for Land in the town of Brighton, for the sum of Fifty-four Dollars, dated January 1, 1831; said note having been paid by said Small, before the passage of said Resolve of the 15th of February 1834, and no abatement having been made on said note.
