Chapter 57.

Resolve in favor of Elijah Hayes, Jun.

Approved March 28, 1837.

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RESOLVED, That there be allowed and paid out of the Treasury of this State the sum of Five Dollars to Elijah Hayes Jun. it being a remuneration for the like sum of Five Dollars which was paid by said Hayes into the Treasury as a duty on a Justice Commission issued in the name of Elijah Hayes 3d, but intended for said Elijah Hayes Jun. and the Governor is hereby authorized and required to draw his warrant on the Treasurer for the same.

Chapter 58.

Resolve in favor of Elizabeth Beckler and James Packard.

Approved March 29, 1837.

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RESOLVED, That James Packard and Elizabeth Beckler be admitted to the benefits of the Resolve of March seventeenth A. D. eighteen hundred and thirty five in favor of "certain officers and soldiers of the Revolutionary War"—and that the Land Agent be authorized to convey to them or their assigns, Two Hundred Acres of land each, to be selected from any lots now vacant in Indian Purchase Number Four, surveyed in eighteen hundred and thirty six by Isaac S. Small Surveyor General.
