### Chapter 43.

Resolve authorizing the sale of a Gun House and site in Castine.

*Approved March 2, 1839.*

RESOLVED, That the Acting Quartermaster General be and he hereby is authorized to dispose of the State's Gun House in the town of Castine and of the lot on which it stands, either at public or private sale, and the net proceeds of sales thereof, shall be paid into the Treasury of the State.

### Chapter 44.

Resolve in favor of Isaac Smith.

*Approved March 4, 1839.*

RESOLVED, That the Land Agent be, and he hereby is, authorized to allow to Isaac Smith of Bangor, in the County of Penobscot, from the amount of stumpage, which may be due the State from said Smith, such sum, as in his judgment, shall equitably compensate said Smith, for building a dam across the mouth of the Grand Seboois Lake, thereby enhancing the value of the timber on the State Lands in that vicinity.

### Chapter 45.

Resolve authorizing the sale of Ordnance and Ordnance Stores in the Arsenal at Portland.

*Approved March 4, 1839.*

RESOLVED, That the Adjutant General be, and he hereby is, authorized to sell, or cause to be sold, such of the ordnance and ordnance stores, now in the Arsenal at Portland, as he may judge to have become useless and unserviceable, and to apply the proceeds thereof in making, or causing to be made, such repairs as he may deem necessary to preserve the buildings at this establishment.
