Chapter 49.

Resolve in favor of Francois Eneas.

Approved March 5, 1839.

RESOLVED, That there be paid out of the Treasury of the State to Francois Eneas the sum of Forty Five Dollars, in full of his services and expenses while in the employ of the State under the Commissioners appointed to ascertain, run and locate the Northeastern Boundary line of the State, in addition to the sum allowed him in the Resolve in favor of John G. Deane and others.

Chapter 50.

Resolve in favor of Benj. C. Atwood.

Approved March 5, 1839.

RESOLVED, That there be paid to Benj. C. Atwood, the sum of seventy-five dollars for extra labor done on Moose River Bridge, and that the Governor, with the advice of Council, be authorized to draw his warrant on the Treasurer for the same.

Chapter 51.

Resolve for the payment of Bounty to the Passamaquoddy Indians upon agricultural productions.

Approved March 5, 1839.

RESOLVED, That there be allowed and paid, out of the Treasury of the State, to John Gleason, Agent for the Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians, the sum of one hundred fifteen dollars and fifty-nine cents, being the amount paid by said Agent, to the Indians aforesaid, for bounty upon agricultural productions.
