Chapter 55.

Resolve in favor of William Shed.

Approved March 7, 1839.

RESOLVED, That there be allowed and paid out of the Treasury of this State, to William Shed of Albany, forty-eight dollars a year, for two years, in consequence of an injury done him, while doing military duty.

Chapter 56.

Resolve for the extension of the Aroostook Road.

Approved March 8, 1839.

RESOLVED, That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of ten thousand dollars, for the extension of the Aroostook Road from the Aroostook to the St. Johns river.

RESOLVED, That the Land Agent be, and he hereby is empowered and directed to expend said sum, in opening and making a road from the Aroostook to the St. Johns river, and to make such deviations from the road, as located by the Surveyor General in A. D. 1837, as may be thought expedient.

RESOLVED, That the Governor, with the advice of Council, is authorized, upon the requisition of the Land Agent, to draw his warrant upon the State Treasurer for the sum aforesaid, for the payment of the expenses of making said road.

RESOLVED, That the Governor be requested to communicate with the Governor of Massachusetts, and request the co-operation of that State by an equal appropriation for making said road.
