Chapter 104.

Resolve in favor of the Town of Corinna.

Approved March 23, 1839.

RESOLVED, That there be allowed and paid from the Treasury of this State to the Treasurer of the town of Corinna, four dollars and eighty-eight cents; it being for an error in the Report of the Committee on Claims, for Bounty on Wheat and Corn.

Chapter 105.

Resolve in favor of the Town of Sebec.

Approved March 23, 1839.

RESOLVED, That there be paid out of the Treasury of State to the Treasurer of the town of Sebec, Ten Dollars, to rectify a mistake made by the Committee in carrying out the returns for Bounty on Wheat and Corn of said town.

Chapter 106.

Resolve in favor Benjamin Partridge and Jedediah Pratt.

Approved March 23, 1839.

RESOLVED, That there be allowed and paid to Benjamin Partridge and Jedediah Pratt, the sum of one dollar and fifty cents for every night they shall have been employed in watching the Public Buildings; and the Governor, with the advice of Council, is authorized to draw his warrant on the Treasurer for the same.
