Range of lots in said town, containing about one hundred and sixty-seven acres; being the same land which was formerly in possession of George McIntosh, a foreigner,— and the release hereby authorized shall be sufficient to vest in said Rebecca, her heirs or assigns, all the right, title and interest which the State has or might have by means of the escheat aforesaid.

Chapter 115.

Resolve regulating the pay of certain Officers and Agents.

Approved March 23, 1839.

RESOLVED, That whenever any Officer of this State, whose salary is fixed by law, shall perform any extra services for the State, or any Agent shall be employed as a Disbursing Officer or otherwise, said Officer or Agent shall render a faithful account of the nature of the service by him performed, the number of days so employed, and the expenses paid out by him; and he shall be entitled to a fair compensation per day for said services, and the expenses, actually paid by him, in the performance of the same; but in no case shall any such Officer or Agent, be entitled to a commission on any money of the State disbursed by him.

Chapter 116.

Resolve in favor of Daniel Moulton, 3d.

Approved March 23, 1839.

RESOLVED, That there be paid out of the Treasury to Daniel Moulton 3d twelve dollars on account of error in making up the Pay Roll of the House.
