Chapter 110.

RESOLVE in favor of the Passamaquoddy Indians.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid out of the treasury of the State, to John Francis and Sebattis Neptune, the sum of fifty dollars, to defray the expenses of their journey to the seat of government, as special agents, chosen by said Indians to call on the Executive and Legislature, upon the business of said Indians. And the Governor with advice of Council, be and he hereby is authorized to draw his warrant on the Treasurer for the same.

Chapter 111.

RESOLVE making an appropriation for paying the expenses already incurred in the erection of a magazine, shed and fences, at the Bangor Arsenal, and for completing the same.

Resolved, That there be allowed and granted for the purpose of paying the expenses already incurred in the erection of a magazine, shed, and fences, at the Bangor Arsenal, and for completing the same, the sum of eight hundred dollars, and the acting quarter master general shall be accountable for the expenditure thereof.

Magazine, &c. at Bangor Arsenal, \$800.
