**Chapter 118.**

RESOLVE in favor of Benjamin Chadbourne.

*Resolved,* That there be paid out of the treasury of this State, to Benjamin Chadbourne of Bradford, the sum of four dollars per month for one year, in consequence of the loss of his health while in the service of the State.

**Chapter 119.**

RESOLVE in favor of Ezekiel Holmes.

*Resolved,* That twenty dollars be paid from the treasury, to Ezekiel Holmes, it being the amount of arrearages due him, as member of the extra session of the Legislature.

**Chapter 120.**

RESOLVE in relation to the distribution of the annual school fund.

*Resolved,* That the Treasurer of State be, and he hereby is authorized and directed, in apportioning the annual school fund among the several cities, towns and plantations in the State, to include all such returns of scholars as may be or shall have been made to the office of the Secretary of State, subsequent to the time required by law, up to the twelfth day of March next, inclusive; and assuming as the basis of apportionment among such cities, towns and plantations, as shall not have made returns at that date, the number of persons between the ages of four and twenty-one years, as returned by the census of eighteen hundred and thirty-seven.
