Chapter 124.

RESOLVE for payment of bounty to the Penobscot Indians upon agricultural productions.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid from the treasury of this State, to Henry Richardson, agent for the Penobscot tribe of Indians, the sum of three hundred fifty-seven dollars and ninety cents, being the amount paid by said agent to the Indians aforesaid, for bounties upon agricultural productions.

Chapter 125.

RESOLVE in favor of George W. Maxim.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of the State, to George W. Maxim of Bangor, the sum of twenty dollars per month, for three years from the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine, in consequence of an injury received by him while in the service of the State.

Chapter 126.

RESOLVE in favor of Dominicus Parker.

Resolved, That the Land Agent is hereby authorized to make and execute a deed in conjunction with the Land Agent of Massachusetts, to Dominicus Parker of Bangor, of the west half of township number four in the fifteenth range of townships west from the east line of the State; *Provided*, said Parker complies with the agreements made in relation to the sale of said half township, between him and the Land Agent of Massachusetts and Rufus McIntire, Esquire, the late Land Agent of Maine.
