And that the Treasurer be also authorized to deduct the said amount, from the annual school fund, number nine, previous to making an apportionment of the same.

Chapter 144.

RESOLVE in favor of Sewall L. Boulter.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of the State, to Sewall L. Boulter, the sum of thirty-five dollars, for expense and damage, sustained by him while in the service of the State under Hastings Strickland, said Boulter having been taken prisoner by the authorities of New Brunswick.

S. L. Boulter, \$35, for damage sustained in Aroostook expedition.

Chapter 145.

RESOLVE in favor of certain soldiers of the town of Abbot.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of this State, to Jacob Leeman, Jun. George W. Rogers, Eliphalet S. Rollins, David Weymouth, Jun. Zenas B. Pool, Orrin Bartlett, Americus Crockett, Samuel K. Lowell, Thomas J. Dutton, John Corson, Samuel Weymouth, Jun. Ebenezer Witham and Charles Flint, the sum of five dollars each, in full for their services in the Aroostook expedition, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine.
