Chapter 124.

AN ACT additional to an act incorporating the Bangor and Piscataquis Canal and Rail Road Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Exempted from sect. 6 of an act relating to rail roads, passed March 7, 1842. The rail road from Bangor to Oldtown, built under the charter of "the Bangor and Piscataquis Canal and Rail Road Company," is hereby exempted from the operation of the sixth section of an act relating to rail roads, passed March seventh, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty two.

[Approved March 24, 1843.]

Chapter 125.

AN ACT to make valid the doings of certain school districts in Belfast.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

School district meetings in Belfast, &c. made valid.

- SECT. 1. In all cases of school district meetings in Belfast, heretofore held, which have been called by any district agent not previously sworn, the doings of such district shall not be deemed void or illegal in consequence thereof.
- SECT. 2. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 126.

AN ACT to apportion and assess on the inhabitants of this state a tax of two hundred one thousand six hundred and three dollars thirty four cents.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. That each city, town, plantation, or other place hereinafter named, within this state, shall be assessed and pay the several sums with which they respectively stand charged, viz:
