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CHAP. 190.**Chapter 190.**

Resolve providing for the erection of a fence on the public grounds.

Erection of a  
fence on the pub-  
lic grounds.

*Resolved*, That the superintendent of the public buildings, shall cause to be erected a good and substantial fence around the public lands, in front of the state house, in Augusta, and he is hereby constituted an agent for the state, for the purpose of proceeding with the proprietors or occupants of adjoining lands, in behalf of the state, as is provided in the revised statutes, chapter twenty nine, for the erection and maintaining of partition fences between individuals; and that the expenses be paid out of the contingent fund; and that the governor with the consent of the council, is hereby authorized to draw his warrant on the treasurer for the same.

**Chapter 191.**

Resolve providing for the repair of the Mattanawcook state road.

Mattanawcook  
state road,  
\$4,000.

*Resolved*, That the sum of four thousand dollars is hereby appropriated out of the treasury of state, to be expended for repairs of the Mattanawcook state road and the bridges thereon, under the direction of the land agent.

**Chapter 192.**

Resolve laying a tax on the several counties in this state.

County tax.

*Resolved*, That the sums annexed to the several counties, contained in the following schedule, are hereby granted as a tax for each county, respectively, to be apportioned, assessed, collected and applied, for the purpose of paying the debt and necessary expenses of the same, and other purposes, ordered by law, viz :

How applied.

York, seven thousand five hundred dollars.

Cumberland, twelve thousand dollars.

Lincoln, eight thousand dollars.

Hancock, six thousand dollars.

Washington, six thousand dollars.

Kennebec, twelve thousand dollars.

Oxford, five thousand dollars.

Somerset, five thousand five hundred dollars.
