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**Chapter 199.**

CHAP. 199.

Resolve in relation to trespasses committed on the public lands.

*Resolved*, That so much of a resolve, entitled a "resolve in relation to trespasses committed on the public lands," approved February fourteenth, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty two, as prohibits the land agent from compromising, or settling, with trespassers on the public lands, when said trespass shall have been accidental, and not wilful, or intentional, is hereby repealed.

Portion of a resolve in relation to trespasses, passed Feb. 14, 1842, repealed.

*Resolved*, That the land agent be allowed to settle with such trespassers, as may have trespassed by going beyond the limits of their permits, in accordance with a practice heretofore adopted by the land agent, of allowing persons cutting timber under permits, to cut timber on the adjoining lands when the timber within the limits of their permits has failed, and the trespass was committed prior to and during the winter of the year one thousand eight hundred and forty two.

Land agent may settle, where trespass is accidental.

**Chapter 200.**

Resolve transferring the polls and estates of the state valuation of Dearborn plantation, and annexing the same to the town of Waterville, in the county of Kennebec.

*Resolved*, That twenty five polls together with five thousand dollars, the state valuation of Dearborn plantation, be added to the five hundred and twenty seven polls and five hundred and thirty nine thousand nine hundred and forty eight dollars, the state valuation of Waterville, in the county of Kennebec, and that the state valuation of Waterville, be, and now stand five hundred and fifty two polls, and estates, five hundred and forty four thousand nine hundred and forty eight dollars.

Polls and estate of Dearborn pl. annexed to Waterville.

**Chapter 201.**

Resolve in favor of Ira Wadleigh.

*Resolved*, That the land agent be, and he hereby is authorized, to surrender to Ira Wadleigh, two notes signed by I. and J. Wadleigh and James Purinton, given to the state for the sum of seven
