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**Chapter 213.****CHAP. 213.**

Resolve making an appropriation for the Insane Hospital.

*Resolved,* That there be appropriated and paid out of the state treasury, for the use of the Insane Hospital of this state, the sum of two thousand dollars, to be expended under the direction of the trustees of said institution, for the purchase of a spring of water, and laying an aqueduct; for the purchase of a carriage and harness; and to defray the current expenses of said institution.

**Chapter 214.**

Resolves authorizing the treasurer to receive the claims of the state against the government of the United States, for expenditures in relation to the northeastern boundary, and claims under the treaty.

*Resolved,* That the treasurer of this state be, and he is hereby authorized to receive from the government of the United States, the amount of the claims of this state for expenses incurred in defending its northeastern boundary, and to make and execute in behalf of this state proper discharges for the same.

Treasurer to receive proceeds of claims against U. States.

*Resolved,* That the treasurer of this state be, and he is hereby authorized to receive from the government of the United States the sum of one hundred and fifty thousand dollars, being the moiety of the sum which the United States agreed to pay the states of Maine and Massachusetts, under article fifth of the treaty of Washington, and to make and execute in behalf of this state, proper discharges for the same.

Also to receive \$150,000 allowed by the U. S. under the late treaty.

**Chapter 215.**

Resolve in favor of Daniel Merrill, and Reuben H. Yeaton.

*Resolved,* That there be paid out of the state treasury, to Daniel Merrill, representative from Falmouth, the sum of fifteen dollars; and to Reuben H. Yeaton, representative from Belgrade, the sum of ten dollars, the same being to defray the expenses of their sickness, during the present session of the legislature.
