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## Chapter 277.

CHAP. 277.

AN ACT additional establishing the salary of the clerk and commissary of the state prison.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

From and after the passage of this act, the salary of the clerk and commissary of the state prison, shall be four hundred dollars per annum, instead of the salary now established by law; and this act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

## Chapter 278.

AN ACT to incorporate the Trustees of the School Fund in the town of Rumford.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECT. 1. The legislature of Massachusetts concurring, the selectmen, town clerk, and treasurer of said town, for the time being, are hereby made a body politic and corporate and constituted trustees of any and all school funds in said town, with all the powers and subject to all the duties of similar corporations, and subject to all the provisions of existing laws.

SECT. 2. The trustees of any school fund in the town of Rumford, constituted under an act entitled "an act to authorize the sale of the ministerial and school lands in the town of Rumford," are hereby empowered and directed to transfer and deliver to the selectmen, town clerk and treasurer, of Rumford, all moneys, notes and other securities, constituting a school fund which they hold by virtue of the act aforesaid.

SECT. 3. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent with this act, are hereby repealed.

## Chapter 279.

AN ACT to set off certain land from Westbrook and annex the same to Portland.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*
