Chapter 354.**CHAP. 354.**

Resolve in favor of the town of Maxfield.

Resolved, That the treasurer of state is hereby authorized to pay to the town of Maxfield, the sum of fifty dollars out of any money not otherwise appropriated; it being for money which the state has received of said town by over taxation.

In favor of the town of Maxfield.

[*Approved March 21, 1845.*]**Chapter 355.**

Resolve in favor of Ashur Martin and others.

Resolved, That the land agent be and he hereby is, authorized to waive the forfeiture of lots numbered fifty-eight, fifty-seven, forty-five, ninety-six and fifty-nine, in township number one, Indian purchase, for one year from the passage of this resolve, and receive the amount due on said lots from the original purchasers, or their assigns, in the same manner as he would have done had said lots not reverted to the state, under the provisions of the twelfth section of an act entitled an act in relation to the public lands, approved March eighteenth, eighteen hundred and forty-two.

[*Approved March 21, 1845.*]**Chapter 356.**

Resolve authorizing the land agent to purchase property attached on demands in favor of the state.

Resolved, That whenever any property which is under attachment on the demands against Stephen Tracy and others, or Rufus Manser, shall be offered for sale on execution, the land agent is hereby authorized to attend said sale and purchase for the use of the state, any or all of said property, real or personal, to the amount of the state's demands *provided* he shall be of the opinion that the interest of the state will be promoted thereby.

Land agent authorized to purchase property attached on demands in favor of the state.
