CHAP. 2.**Chapter 2.**

Resolve in relation to the distribution of the annual school fund.

Relative to the
distribution of
the annual school
fund.

Resolved, That the treasurer of state, is hereby authorized and directed, to apportion the annual school fund among the several cities, towns and plantations in the state including all such returns of schools as may be, or shall have been made to the office of the secretary of state, subsequent to the time required by law, up to the tenth day of June next, inclusive; and to assume as a basis of apportionment among such cities, towns and plantations, as have not made returns at that date, the number of persons between the ages of four and twenty-one years, in those cities, towns and plantations, as stated in the apportionment of the bank tax of last year; *provided*, that in making the apportionment for towns which have been divided, since they made their last return, the treasurer be authorized to deduct from the number of scholars, so many as have been returned from the new towns set off therefrom.

Chapter 3.

Resolve to abate a portion of the state tax to the town of St. Albans and to add the same to the town of Hartland.

Part of state tax
abated from St.
Albans and add-
ed to Hartland.

Resolved, That the state treasurer be, and he hereby is directed to abate twenty-two dollars and forty-nine cents of the state tax assessed to the town of St. Albans for the year eighteen hundred and forty-seven; and to add the same amount to the state tax for the same year set to the town of Hartland.

Chapter 4.

Resolve in favor of Jedediah Fairfield.

In favor of Jede-
diah Fairfield.

Resolved, That the further time of one year be allowed Jedediah Fairfield to erect a grist mill, and a further time of three years to perform the settling duties in township number four in the fifth range of townships west from the east line of the state agreeable to a resolve in favor of Jedediah Fairfield, approved March sixteenth, one thousand eight hundred and forty-three.
