Chapter 137.

CHAP. 137.

Resolve authorizing the state treasurer to credit to the county of Oxford a certain part of their county tax for eighteen hundred and forty-eight.

Whereas, by accident the return of the assessment of the county tax for Oxford county, on townships and tracts not assessed by the assessors of any town or organized plantation in the said county for the year eighteen hundred and forty-eight, was not received within three months thereafter by the treasurer of this state: *and whereas* the said treasurer of the state does not feel authorized to credit the said county with the amount of said tax. Therefore

Tax on unincorporated places.

Resolved, That the treasurer of this state be authorized and directed to give credit to the treasurer of the said county of Oxford, for the amount of the said tax on the books of the state treasurer, and forward a certificate of the same to the said county treasurer; and also cause the said assessment to be published in the newspaper of the printer to the state within three months from the final passage of this resolve.

Duty of treasurer of state.

Chapter 138.

Resolve in favor of William A. Herrick.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of the state to William A. Herrick of Greene, a pension of fifty dollars annually for five years from the approval of this resolve by the governor, on account of an injury received while performing services in the Aroostook expedition.

Pension of \$50 per annum, for five years.

Chapter 139.

Resolve in favor of William W. Quimby.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of this state to William W. Quimby of Bucksport, forty-eight dollars per year for four years from the first day of January, A. D. eighteen hundred and forty-nine, on account of an injury received while performing military service in the town of Athens.

Pension of \$48 per annum, for five years.
