CHAP. 320.

Chapter 320.

An act additional to "an act authorizing the town of North Yarmouth to dispose of the old meeting house in said town," approved March first, eighteen hundred and thirty-six.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Proviso repealed.

Proviso.

The proviso contained in the second section of the act to which this is additional is hereby repealed; and no forfeitures shall take place from the operation of said proviso: *provided*, that nothing in this act shall be construed as repealing any of the provisions of the act entitled, "an act to incorporate the town of Yarmouth," approved August eighth, eighteen hundred and forty-nine.

Chapter 321.

An act to make valid the doings of the several school districts in the town of Belfast.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Acts of school districts made valid.

SECT. 1. The acts and doings of the several school districts in the town of Belfast, had at any and all meetings of any or either of said districts prior to the passage of this act, shall be adjudged legal and valid, in all questions or suits at law, which may hereafter arise touching the same, or which may result from any contract made by any or either of said districts.

Rights in property sold for taxes not effected.

SECT. 2. Nothing herein contained shall effect the rights of any person to any real or personal property, which has been sold or forfeited for the non-payment of taxes assessed by order of such districts.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.
