**Chapter 331.****CHAP. 331.**

An act additional to an act to establish the York and Cumberland Railroad Company.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECT. 1. The capital stock of the York and Cumberland Railroad Company is hereby increased twenty-two thousand shares, so that the capital stock of said company shall consist of not less than five thousand nor more than thirty thousand shares of fifty dollars each.

Capital stock  
increased  
\$11,000.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.

**Chapter 332.**

An act to repeal chapter three hundred and seventy-seven of the private and special laws of the state of Maine.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Chapter three hundred and seventy-seven of the private and special laws of this state, approved August fourth, eighteen hundred forty-six, entitled "an act relating to bowling alleys in Bath," is hereby repealed.

**Chapter 333.**

An act empowering school district number one in Gardiner to raise money for the support of public schools therein.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECT. 1. The inhabitants of school district number one, in the city of Gardiner, are hereby authorized to raise by tax upon the polls and estates in said district, such sum of money, not exceeding four hundred dollars in one year, as may be deemed necessary to aid in the support of public schools in said district.
