Chapter 221.

Resolve in favor of Manly Eames.

Resolved, That there be paid from the treasury of the state, out of any moneys not otherwise appropriated, to Manly Eames, twenty-seven dollars, it being for the usual travel from his residence to Augusta and three days' attendance.

Travel and attendance, \$27, member of the legislature.

Chapter 222.

Resolve in favor of John Goberlell.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of this state to John Goberlell the sum of fifty dollars, it being to remunerate him for expenses incurred in traveling to and from the seat of government as agent of the Passamaquoddy Indians, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty.

\$50, remuneration for expenses incurred, as agent of his tribe.
