Chapter 240.

CHAP. 240.

Resolve in favor of Joseph Tobin and others.

Resolved, That the state treasurer be authorized and directed to pay to Joseph Tobin, William H. Britton, Sylvester Jones, Stephen Leavitt, Thaddeus Hine, George W. Springer, William G. Soper, Eli Soper, Rufus Delano and Alexander Nelson, the sum of twenty dollars and fifty-six cents—it being for tax wrongfully assessed upon a tract of land known as Chandler's Gore and annexed to the towns of Livermore and Hartford.

Chapter 241.

Resolve in favor of Henry F. Eaton and Joseph E. Eaton.

Resolved, That the land agent be, and hereby is authorized to discharge the forfeiture upon lots numbered six, seven, sixteen, seventeen, twenty, twenty-one, twenty-two, thirty-five, forty-six, forty-nine, sixty-one, sixty-four, sixty-seven, seventy-six, seventy-seven, seventy-eight and eighty-one, in the east half of township number six, in the second range, north of Bingham's Penobscot purchase, containing three thousand and eighty acres more or less, upon being paid by Henry F. Eaton and Joseph E. Eaton the proportion due upon said lots of the original amount of the taxes and charges, (with interest at the rate of six per cent.) for which said east half of township number six, second range was returned to the land agent by the treasurer of state, March twenty-third, eighteen hundred forty-nine; *provided*, the land agent shall not have sold the said half township for the taxes aforesaid, charges and interest, before the passage of this resolve, and *provided further*, that nothing herein contained shall be construed to affect the rights of parties who may have heretofore purchased any part of said township number six, range second, at any sale for the non-payment of taxes assessed on the whole of said township.

Land agent authorized to discharge the forfeiture upon certain lots, upon being paid the proportion of the original amount of taxes and charges, with interest.
