Chapter 244.

Resolve for the payment of accounts against the state.

For payment of accounts against the state.

Resolved, That there be paid from the treasury of the state out of any money not otherwise appropriated, to the several persons, towns and plantations mentioned in the roll of accounts numbered thirty-one, the sums set against their names respectively, amounting in the aggregate to the sum of five thousand nine hundred forty-four dollars and fifty-four cents, in full discharge of the accounts and demands to which they severally refer.

Chapter 245.

Resolve in favor of Thomas S. Roberts.

Land agent authorized to convey 160 acres of land in township No. 3, R. 8.

Resolved, That the land agent for this state be and hereby is authorized to convey to Thomas S. Roberts one hundred and sixty acres of land to be selected by himself in township number three, eighth range, west half, in the county of Penobscot and north of the Waldo patent, so called.

Chapter 246.

Resolve providing for the repair of the military road.

Land agent authorized to expend \$400.

—directed to make application to the state of Massachusetts to refund said money. Resolved, That the land agent is hereby authorized to expend the sum of four hundred dollars, for the repair of the military road in township number two, range three, west from the east line of the state; and said agent is directed to make application to the state of Massachusetts to refund said money, the fee of said township being in said state of Massachusetts.
