Chapter 313.**CHAP. 313.**

Resolve providing for the expenses of members and officers of the house of representatives, and clerk of the valuation committee, incurred by sickness.

Resolved, That there be paid to A. B. Farwell, assistant clerk of the house, fifty-one dollars and fifty cents; to J. C. Talbot, one of the clerks of the valuation committee, five dollars; to William S. Lee, member of the house of representatives, nineteen dollars; to Loring D. Hayes, member of the house of representatives, twenty-four dollars fifty cents, expenses severally incurred by them in sickness, while in discharge of their duties as aforesaid.

Chapter 314.

Resolve in favor of John Huckins.

Resolved, That the treasurer of state be directed to abate the interest which is or may be due the state on a road tax of two hundred and twenty-five dollars, assessed on township number one in the third range in the county of Aroostook, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, and which now stands charged against said township.

Chapter 315.

Resolve in favor of St. Albans Academy.

Resolved, That the land agent of this state is hereby authorized and directed to convey to the trustees of the St. Albans Academy, one-half township of land, to be selected from any lands held in severalty by this state.

Three-quarters of the money arising from the sale of said land, to be forever kept as a permanent fund for the use of said academy.
