SECT. 2. This act shall be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 455.

An act for the repairing and improving the hospital for the insane.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

There shall be appropriated and paid out of the Appropriation for state treasury for the repair and improvement of the insane hospital the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars to be expended under the direction of John W. Dana, Hugh J. Anderson and Henry Carter with a view to its ultimate completion as originally designed, with such alterations and improvements as the safety and comfort of its inmates may require.

This act shall take effect and be in force, from and after its approval by the governor.
