CHAP. 350.**Chapter 350.**

Resolve for the pay roll of the house of representatives.

Payment of pay
roll of house.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of this state, to the several persons named in the foregoing pay roll, the sums set against their names respectively, amounting in the whole to eight thousand eight hundred and seventy-six dollars and fifty cents.

Chapter 351.

Resolve repealing a resolve in favor of Waite plantation, approved July twenty-third, eighteen hundred and forty-nine.

Waite plantation.

Resolved, That the resolve in favor of Waite plantation, approved July twenty-third, in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and forty-nine, be and the same is hereby repealed. This resolve shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 352.

Resolve in favor of the town of Richmond.

Town of
Richmond.

Whereas the town of Richmond has lost by a fire which occurred in the night of May eighth, eighteen hundred forty-eight, certain copies of the public and private acts and resolves and reports of the state, allowed them by law, therefore

Resolved, That the secretary of state be and is hereby authorized to supply said town with such numbers as he may be satisfied were lost.
