CHAP. 358.**Chapter 358.**

Resolve allowing the adjutant general compensation for clerk hire.

Adjutant general.
Clerk hire.

Resolved, That the sum of three hundred dollars per annum be allowed to the adjutant general for clerk hire, until otherwise ordered. This resolve to take effect from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 359.

Resolve laying a tax on the counties of York and Aroostook, for the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and fifty-one.

Tax on counties
of York and
Aroostook.

Resolved, That the sums annexed to the counties hereinafter named, are hereby granted as a tax for each county respectively, to be appropriated, assessed, collected and applied, for the purpose of paying the debts and necessary expenses of the same, and other purposes ordered by law, to wit:

York, twelve thousand and five hundred dollars.

Aroostook, ten thousand and two hundred dollars.

Chapter 360.

Resolve in favor of the Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians.

Passamaquoddy
Indians to finish
priest's house.

Resolved, That there be appropriated from the Indian fund, for the aid of the Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians, to finish a house for the priest to reside in, now in progress of construction, the sum of four hundred dollars, and that the governor and council be authorized to appoint an agent to expend the same.

Chapter 361.

Resolve in favor of Emery O. Bean.

Emery O. Bean.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury to Emery O. Bean, the sum of forty-five dollars, for services as a member of this house.
