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CHAP. 376.

Chapter 376.

Resolves making an appropriation for the repairs of the state prison.

State prison, appropriation for repairs of.

\$7,000 for dwelling house, watch house, &c.

\$2,000 for wall, &c.

*Resolved*, That there be, and is hereby appropriated, the sum of nine thousand dollars, out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of repairing the state prison buildings at Thomaston, and the enclosures around the same, as follows, viz: seven thousand dollars for rebuilding the dwelling house for the warden, watch house, guard house, office, and repairing and slating the hospital and the main prison; also two thousand dollars for building the wall and gate way; to be expended under the advice and direction of the inspectors of the prison, by an agent to be appointed by the governor and council.

*Resolved*, That the governor, with the advice of the council, is hereby authorized to draw his warrant from time to time on the treasury, in favor of the agent appointed under the foregoing resolve, for the purpose of defraying the expenses contemplated in the foregoing resolve.
