Chapter 62.

Resolve for the erection of a monument in memory of the late honorable William King, first governor of Maine.

Resolved, That the governor and council are hereby authorized to expend a sum not exceeding five hundred dollars, in the erection of a suitable monument to the memory of the late honorable William King, first chief magistrate of this state, in commemoration of his distinguished ability and sagacity as a statesman, and of his preeminent and successful services in behalf of the interests of his native state.

Chapter 63.

Resolve reducing the valuation of the town of Dedham, in the county of Hancock.

Resolved, That the state valuation of the year eighteen hundred and fifty, for the county of Hancock, be amended by deducting from the valuation of the town of Dedham, the sum of ten hundred dollars, and adding this sum to the valuation of the town of Ellsworth.
