Chapter 77.

Resolve in favor of Eli Goss.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of the state to Eli Goss of Portland, four dollars for each month from the first day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, to the first day of January in the year eighteen hundred and fifty-three; and the sum of eight dollars per month, from the first day of January, eighteen hundred and fifty-three, during his life, in consideration of a severe and permanent injury received by him while in the military service of the state in the Aroostook expedition in the winter of eighteen hundred and thirty-nine. And the resolve in favor of Eli Goss, approved March twenty-eighth, eighteen hundred and fifty-three, is hereby repealed.

Chapter 78.

Resolve in favor of Edward Foster.

Resolved, That the governor and council be authorized to settle the account of Edward Foster for services rendered the state under a resolve approved March twenty-fourth, eighteen hundred and fifty-three.
