Chapter 349.

CHAP. 349.

An act to authorize the Bangor Mercantile Association to appoint port wardens for the port of Bangor.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

The Bangor Mercantile Association may appoint port wardens for the port of Bangor, not exceeding three in number for the port of said Bangor, whose duty it shall be, when called upon by ship masters or owners thereof so to do, to visit such ships and vessels as may be designated, for the purpose of discharging such duties as port wardens in other cities and seaports are usually called upon and empowered to perform.

Chapter 350.

An act authorizing the proprietors of the First Congregational meeting house in Winthrop to repair, sell or rebuild said meeting house.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

The proprietors of the First Congregational parish meeting house in Winthrop are hereby empowered, at any legal meeting, by a majority vote of said proprietors, to repair, remodel, sell and convey the house and lot on which it stands, or take down said house, and remove and rebuild the same in such manner as they shall direct. If a sale of said house shall be ordered, the proprietors shall, previous to the time of sale, cause the relative value of the pews in said meeting house to be appraised by three disinterested men, and the proceeds of said sale shall be divided among the pew owners of said meeting house, according to said appraisal, either in money or investment in pews of a new meeting house, according as a majority of said proprietors may determine.
