Chapter 353.

An act to incorporate the Baldwin Boot and Shoe Manufacturing Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. Thomas Binford, Cyrus S. Brown, Jonathan Bunnell, Albert Sanborn, Christopher D. Sawyer, Cyrus F. Bunnell, Lorenzo Q. Sanborn, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby created a body politic and corporate by the name of the Baldwin Boot and Shoe Manufacturing Company, for the purpose of manufacturing boots, shoes, brogans, pegs, and any other article used in the manufacture of boots and shoes, at Baldwin, in the county of Cumberland; and said corporation shall have all the powers and privileges, and be subject to the duties and requirements, generally incident to such corporations.

Corporators.

Corporate name.

Purpose of corporation.

General powers.

SECT. 2. Said corporation may take and hold real and personal estate to an amount not exceeding in the whole, at any one time, the value of twenty thousand dollars.

Capital.

SECT. 3. The first meeting of said corporation may be called by either one of the three first named corporators, by written notice delivered in person, said notice to be fourteen days at least prior to said meeting.

First meeting.

Chapter 354.

An act to make valid the doings of the town of Greenville.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. The doings of the town of Greenville, at their annual meeting for the choice of town officers, holden on the eleventh day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-three, are hereby declared to be valid and sufficient in law, notwithstanding any omissions appearing upon the records of said town.

Greenville, certain acts of, made valid.

SECT. 2. This act shall not apply to or affect any right of action now existing, nor to any action or process now pending.

Act not to affect cases now pending.
