the treasury of the state semi-annually, to be computed from the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, and to continue during his natural life. And that there shall be paid out of the state treasury to the said Trask, twelve dollars per month for two years as arrearage, commencing on the first day of January, eighteen hundred and forty-eight, and ending on the first day of January, eighteen hundred and fifty.

Chapter 105.

Resolve in favor of Waite plantation.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of the state to the assessors of Waite plantation, in the county of Washington, the sum of forty-four dollars and nineteen cents, in part for expenses incurred by said plantation under a resolve of the legislature, approved July twenty-third, eighteen hundred and forty-nine.

Chapter 106.

Resolve in favor of the Penobscot Indians.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the state treasury the sum of three hundred dollars, for the purpose of maintaining a school for the education of said Indians, subject to the same provisions as a resolve entitled a "Resolve to promote the education of the Penobscot Indians," approved February twenty-sixth, eighteen hundred and fifty-three.

Chapter 107.

Resolve in favor of Alexander G. Turner.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the state treasury, to Alexander G. Turner of Hebron, four dollars per month during the pleasure of the legislature, for injuries received while in the service of the state.
