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before the publication of said notice; and he shall specify in said advertisement, the notes and demands, the amount of principal due thereon, and the name or names of the promisers; and if said notes are not paid within one year from the first day of January, eighteen hundred and fifty-five, all the tracts, townships or parcels of land for which the aforesaid notes were given shall be and the same are hereby declared forfeited to the state without any further time for redeeming the same, together with all payments made thereon.

### Chapter 189.

Resolve in favor of Thomas Dixon.

*Resolved*, That there be paid from the treasury of state, out of any money not otherwise appropriated, the sum of fifteen dollars and eighty-eight cents to Thomas Dixon, as coroner, for expenses of taking an inquisition on the dead body of a foreigner.

### Chapter 190.

Resolve in relation to the promulgation of the laws of the state.

*Resolved*, That a resolve approved March first, eighteen hundred forty-two, entitled, "Resolve additional for the promulgation of the laws of the state," be amended by striking out the words "five dollars" and inserting the words "ten dollars."
