SECT. 2. The capital stock of said bank shall be fifty thousand Capital stock
 dollars, divided into shares of one hundred dollars each; and said \$50,000.
 bank shall be located and established in the city of Bath, in the Shares.
 county of Sagadahoc. Location.

SECT. 3. Said corporators are hereby authorized and empowered Powers and
 to exercise all the rights and privileges conferred upon such corpo- privileges.
 rations by the laws of this state, and shall be subject to all the
 liabilities and restrictions thereof.

Chapter 532.

An Act to change the name of the town of Kirkland.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
 Legislature assembled, as follows:*

From and after the passage of this act, the name of the town of Kirkland, name
 of, changed to
 Hudson.
 Kirkland in the County of Penobscot, shall cease, and said town
 shall henceforth be known and called by the name of Hudson; and
 nothing in this act contained shall be construed to impair any
 rights or liabilities of said corporation.

Chapter 533.

An Act to amend chapter one hundred and forty-five of the private and special laws of
 the year eighteen hundred and fifty-three.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
 Legislature assembled, as follows:*

That the first section of said act is hereby amended by striking Liability of mill
 owners on Union
 river.
 out in said section the words, "unless he or they upon request of
 any person desiring to prosecute or sue for the penalty shall appear
 and give such information as shall be known to him or them of the
 person or persons who committed the offense or offenses."
