Chapter 214.**CHAP. 214.**

Resolve in favor of Thomas Goss.

Resolved, That the land agent be authorized and directed to convey to Thomas Goss, all the right, title and interest, which the state has in and to lots numbered twenty-three and twenty-four in township numbered fifteen in the sixth range, west from the east line of the state, as lotted by Zebulon Bradley, in the year eighteen hundred and forty-four.

Chapter 215.

Resolve authorizing the acting quarter master general to dispose of certain military property.

Resolved, That the acting quarter master general be and he is hereby authorized to sell, at public or private sale, such small arms or other articles of military property, in the arsenals at Portland and Bangor, or elsewhere belonging to the state, as may be deemed unservicable, according to the standard laid down by the secretary of war of the United States, the net proceeds to be applied to military purposes, for the benefit of the volunteer militia; or to exchange for their equivalent in ordnance, ordnance stores or camp equipage, of a more improved or recent pattern, such small arms or other military property held unservicable as aforesaid; said acting quarter master general to be allowed by the governor and council a reasonable compensation for expenses, and to furnish a list of all property disposed of, with the prices or articles obtained therefor, to the governor and council; *Provided*, that the small arms disposed of as above, shall not exceed in proportion more than one half of the whole number belonging to the state.

Chapter 216.

Resolve for support of schools among the Passamaquoddy Indians.

Resolved, That the governor and council be authorized to expend the sum of one hundred dollars, to aid in the support of schools among the Passamaquoddy Indians, if in their judgment, the amount can be advantageously used for that purpose.
