CHAP. 91.

Chapter 91.

An act to incorporate the Norombega Bank.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Corporators.

SECT. 1. Thomas A. White, S. P. Strickland, J. O. B. Darling, John S. Sayward, Solomon Dunning, Charles O. Fanning and Franklin Muzzy, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby incorporated into a company by the name of the President, Directors and Company of the Norombega Bank.

Corporate name.

Capital stock
\$100,000.
Shares.

SECT. 2. The capital stock of said bank shall be one hundred thousand dollars, divided into shares of one hundred dollars each, and said bank shall be located at Bangor.

Powers, privileges, &c.

SECT. 3. The said corporators are hereby authorized to exercise all the rights and privileges conferred upon such corporations by the laws of this state, and shall be subject to all the restrictions and liabilities thereof.

Chapter 92.

An act to incorporate the Penobscot River Bank.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Corporators.

SECT. 1. David Bugbee, Caleb Billings, C. P. Brown, William Emerson, John S. Ricker, W. H. Bishop, John A. Peters, J. W. Patten and Thomas Jenness, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby incorporated into a company, by the name of the President, Directors and Company of the Penobscot River Bank.

Corporate name.

Capital stock
\$100,000.
Shares.

SECT. 2. The capital stock of said bank shall be one hundred thousand dollars, divided into shares of one hundred dollars each; said bank to be located at Bangor, in the county of Penobscot.

Location.

Powers, privileges, &c.

SECT. 3. Said corporators are hereby authorized and empowered to exercise all the rights and privileges conferred upon such corporations by the laws of this state, and shall be subject to all the liabilities and restrictions thereof.
