CHAP. 46.**Chapter 46.**

Resolve authorizing the treasurer of state to renew a note to the Trustees of Maine Insane Hospital.

Note, surrender
of.

—renewal of.

Resolved, That upon the surrender of note number thirty-six, for five hundred dollars, part of the state loan of eighteen hundred and forty-one, belonging to the Trustees of Maine Insane Hospital, the treasurer of state be, and is hereby authorized, to make a note in behalf of the state, to said trustees for the same sum, payable at the pleasure of the state, with interest, payable semi-annually; and also to pay interest from the time when said old note became due, to date of surrender.

Chapter 47.

Resolve in favor of the Maine Insane Hospital.

Insane Hospital,
in favor of.

Resolved, That whenever the trustees of the insane hospital shall pay into the treasury of state fifteen hundred dollars, part of the bequest to them by the late John Black, Esq., for the use of the library of the hospital, the treasurer of state be, and is hereby authorized to receive said sum, and to give his note in behalf of the state therefor, to said trustees, payable at the pleasure of the state, with interest, semi-annually.

Chapter 48.

Resolve in favor of Phineas Boynton.

Phineas Boynton,
in favor of.

Resolved, That there be paid out of any money in the treasury, not otherwise appropriated, to Phineas Boynton, the sum of one hundred and twenty-five dollars, it being for repairs on the bridge across the Aroostook river, at number eleven, range five, in eighteen hundred and fifty-four.
